We will be making the snowman wall hanging that is pictured below the list of supplies.



Supplies Needed:

A completed 12 1/2" block to use in the wall hanging (this is the block that the snowman is holding. Having this completed ahead of time will give more time to finish the project during the workshop).

Fabric:

- 5/8 yard sky (blue tones)
- 1/2 yard snow (white tones)
- 1/4 yard hat fabric (black tones)
- 2 yards border and binding
- 1/2 yard accent border
- a bit of orange (nose)

Batting (crib size) Fusible Web Basic sewing supplies **sky:** 1 strip 3 1/2" X WOF

2 rectangles 3 1/2" X 4 1/2" 2 squares 2 1/2" X 2 1/2" 4 strips 2 1/2" X WOF 2 rectangles 2 1/2" X 7 1/2"

leave the rest whole 1 strip 1/1/2" X WOF 8 squares 1 1/2" X 1 1/2"

snow: 1 square 12 1/2" X 12"

1 rectangle 7 1/2" X 8 1/2"

black: 1 rectangle 4 1/2" X 6 1/2"

1 rectangle 1 1/2" X 10 1/2" circles for eyes and mouth

accent border: 3 strips 1 1/2" X WOF

border: 3 strips 3 1/2" X WOF **binding**: 3 strips 2 1/4" X WOF


