### Happy Thanksgiving!

I was northwest of Concord Friday and Saturday. The leaves are finally turning into beautiful colors. Have you had a chance to see any? I saw a beautiful red tree this morning on my way to church.

Don't forget this month is our collection time for Cooperative Christian Ministries (CCM). You can bring non-perishables or a check (so they can buy in bulk). Here is their current needs as stated on their website.

- 1. Canned chicken
- 2. Macaroni & cheese, pasta (other than spaghetti), rice
- 3. Other canned meats (hash, chili, Vienna sausages, etc.)
- 4. Canned corn, peas, carrots, potatoes, and mixed vegetables
- 5. Pasta sauce, peanut butter, cereal, soup and shelf-stable milk
- 6. Any kind of canned beans (baked, chili, kidney, etc.) except for pintos
- 7. Any canned fruit (mixed, pears, pineapple, etc.)
- 8. Diapers

They especially seek low sodium, no sugar-added, and whole grain items. Currently, they have plenty of: Tuna, green beans, canned tomatoes, pinto beans, spaghetti, and canned peaches.

**Programs,** Mary Jo Ward: October's program is Quilted Jackets presented by member Tiffany Harwood. Workshop is making a quilted jacket. Tiffany shared with us several of her own Quilted Jackets and shared with us how she got started in making them. She prefers Gildan sweatshirts and orders them from JiffyShirt.com. Granite Knitwear in Granite Quarry also carries sweatshirts.

**Community Service,** Carol Harris and Charlotte Doyle shared we will still meet in October and November at the Fire Station for Charity sewing. Charlotte came to an agreement with Parks and Rec to continue meeting at the Fire Station every 2<sup>nd</sup> Friday for Charity Sewing. This meeting will be advertised to the

community inviting them to come join us.

**Christmas Party:** Melba Mick announced she needs 10 table captains for the Christmas Party and the group will decide the theme of the party.

#### Break

After the break, Mary Shea won the door prize.

**2024 Quilt Show,** Sandra Allred and Stephanie Newbrough: Sandra reported they heard back from West Cabarrus High School. We can use their common area next year for the show. The dates are June 27-29. She began updating show documents. She has contacted 41 vendors requesting a reply on whether they are interested or not in vending at the show. Five have replied yes, so far. She reminded members we will need many volunteers to do the show.

Sandra hopes to meet with the Asst. Principal soon in order to sign the contract for the space. In the meantime, she is working on what is needed and signup sheets.

Sandra and Stephanie discussed judging. With a new location for the show, they decided to do a viewer's choice again. We will learn this year how the location works for us and figure out how to host a judged show in the location. Signups to help will be coming soon. Right now, I need a volunteer to help with publicity. I'd like to get ads in "The Register", on our website and any other places we can think of. After the meeting Janneke agreed to help Sandra with the advertising.

Several members questioned not having a judged show. They are interested in having it judged. Questions asked ...

- How would we store the quilts for judging and until the show?
- · Where could we have the judging? Poplar Grove Baptist now meet in the room we rented in the past for judging.

President Announcements, Sandra Allred:

- Next month we will have our CCM collection: can goods, or cash, check
- Sandra reported the board discussed updating the VP responsibilities by removing Door Prizes and making it a separate position. The board voted yes to make this change. This will allow the VP and President to be more closely aligned and work together more.

We are supposed to vote on our new board this month, however we currently do not have a vice president or a secretary. We need these positions filled ASAP or December will be our last meeting. Carol Eicher and Mary Shea volunteered to fill the 2 remaining positions and the Executive Board was voted in. See officers and committee chairs below.

Membership, Ann Weaver: reported 45 member's present, 1 on zoom and 0 new members. This year we have 11 new members, 2 of those are returning members from the past.

Sandra adjourned our meeting at 7:50 PM after "Show and Tell" was held.
