Message from the President

From the President's Desk

What is under your needle this month? I decided to be proactive and get my March UFO out and see just how much work was left on the quilt. And then I discovered why I put it aside. This quilt was designed by a precision designer. It involves around 560 half square triangles that the strategy is designed for perfect blocks with no trimming. But I found that most of my HSTs were smaller than required and my blocks were not lining up. Now the good news is that in the year since I put that aside, I have improved my precision skills and I think I can rescue this quilt. I am looking forward to another year of learning new skills and challenging my comfort zone of quilting.

Are you getting excited about the Quilt Show this year? I am. We are looking forward to all the beautiful quilts and quilted items that will be submitted. There have been some changes to the entry rules for the quilts. The biggest element is that members and non-members can submit as many quilts for judging as they want with a limit of two quilts per category. Display Only Quilts have been moved to a separate category and will be no charge. Quilts made after January 1, 2020 can be entered. Since the 2022 CQG show was Viewers Choice then quilts entered in that show can also be entered for judging in this show. The Entry Form, revised rules and category descriptions are now available. We will spend time during the meeting highlighting some of the changes and answering questions.

For a Quilt Show to succeed we will need the support of our members. Now is the time to clean out your quilting room to support either Silent Auction, White Elephant, or Raffle Basket. Please contact the chairs for each of these committees regarding what they need. There are also many opportunities for volunteering, whether it is before the event to support Judging, Set-up, Advertising, Vendors, or supporting any of the numerous committees that will need to get their materials together for the show. On the days of the show we will need volunteers for working the front doors, supporting the vendors, raffle quilt ticket sales, and any of the booths that we will have for Silent Auction, White Elephant, or Raffle Basket. I am sure you can find opportunities that match your interests and capabilities.

We still have a few seats available for the workshop with Kathleen Rountree. If you would like to learn more about all the elements of a Quilt Show, reach out to Mary Jo Ward, Janet Gillan or myself and we will reserve your seat.

Meeting Minutes

January 8, 2024

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by President Debra Mills at 6:30 PM.

Welcome Visitors: No visitors.

Membership:

- Debra Mills reminded members of the minimum requirements for guild members – pay membership dues, turn in one charity quilt, and sell 25 tickets for the raffle quilt.
- Two new members joined – Lisa Bynam and Colleen Lane. 43 members present at the meeting. No members on Zoom.
- Terri Patterson was available to take pictures for the Guild Directory for new members and any prior members wanting a picture update. If you prefer, you can text Terri a picture to use. Also review the guild information and provide Terri updates to your information if needed.

Approval of December 2023 Minutes:

Evelyn Dugan made a motion to approve our December 2023 membership meeting minutes with amendments. Barbara Horne-Stead seconded the motion. Two amendments will be made to the final version.

Outreach:

*Carol Harris noted there are 12 members that have not turned in charity quilts for 2023. Please see Carol if you have any issues. She will be reaching out soon as needed.

*Parks and Rec have solidified the dates for using the facility at Fire Station 9 for charity sewing. The charity sewing days are the second Friday of each month. Members must work on charity quilts. This event is now open to the public and will be advertised in the coming issue of the magazine put out by Parks and Rec.

*Carol Harris presented four options for charity quilts and two options for bears to choose from for 2024 contributions. Prior to the vote on charities for 2024, Carol provided additional information. Eldercare was removed since they wanted to send the charity quilts to Romania. CVAN provided Carol statistics to consider. In 2022 the shelter served 46 women and 58 children. The call hotline processed 1594 calls. 1343 women and children received services. On average CVAN uses 50 quilts. Our guild was the only guild providing quilts. Jeff Gordan Children's Foundation can use the bears as well as Victory Junction. Victory Junction is a three hour drive to deliver. There were coordination issues noted in the past. Atrium University NICU prefers quilts that are 45x60. There is no requirement for the bears to have the black and white checked arms and legs.

* The members voted on the three charities to contribute to in 2024 and which group would receive the bears in 2024. The charities selected by the membership for 2024 are Jeff Gordon Children's Foundation, Hospice, and Atrium University NICU. The Jeff Gordon Children's Foundation will receive the bears created in 2024.

Raffle Quilt:

- Sandra Allred announced tickets for the 2024 raffle quilt are being sold at the Sanford Quilt Show January 12 and 13. A sign up sheet is available for those interested. You can sell your own tickets at that event if you wish. Sanford does require sellers to purchase entry. The guild sold quite a few tickets for the 2023 quilt at this location.
- Pick up your tickets to sell from Darlene Woodham if you have not received yours yet.

- Raffle Quilt for 2025 – a chair and committee are still needed.

Activities:

- Darlene Woodham addressed the 2024 activities.
- UFO challenge was explained in detail. Members can submit the forms in February if needed. Many submitted forms at the current meeting. The first UFO is due at the March meeting.
- February activity is a quilt magnet. A sample was shown. Members need to bring their completed magnet to the February meeting.
- In February the inspiration for the Challenge Quilt will be selected. Members are to bring a magazine of any kind. A page will be selected. Members are to tear out that page or photocopy and make a quilt no larger than 100 inches for a perimeter (25x25 if square). The challenge quilts will be put into the quilt show so they are all due by June 10. They are not judged and there is no charge to submit them.
- Darlene provided an update on all the activities planned for the year. A complete list of all activities and the due date are listed in the chart under Programs in this newsletter.

Programs:

- Since Debra Mills moved to the President position, she is no longer a co-chair for Programs. She requested a volunteer to step into the vacant role.
- February's program is Kathleen Rountree. The Tuesday workshop will be how to run a quilt show. This program will be made available to outside the guild participants. There is a limit of 20 participants.
- March's program is a watercolor technique to make a Watercolor Heart Quilt by guild member Janet Gillan.

Quilt Show Update:

Sandra Allred discussed the status of the quilt show planning.

- The floor plan was finalized. There is room for an estimated 300 quilts.

-
- One vendor has committed. There are 5 others in consideration. There is room for many vendors.
 - Judges have been contacted. Kathryn Zimmerman and Delia Dorn are the selected judges.
 - Debra is holding a meeting Wednesday, January 10, to finalize the intake form.
 - The group is still looking for a location for quilt intake and judging. It needs to be a location with many long tables. Carol Harris recommended her prior employer training room. Debra and Carol will discuss further.
 - Forms will be on the website soon.
 - Volunteer signups for the quilt show began. A sign-up sheet was provided.
 - There will be a QOV display and possibly a raffle.
 - Admission volunteers will determine what if anything will be given to attendees. In 2022 we provided a free fat quarter.
 - Someone is needed to create the Guild Display on What We Do so that attendees can see samples of what we do.
 - While not a membership requirement, all members are asked to volunteer in some capacity at the quilt show.
 - Raffle baskets will be limited to two which may be door prizes.
 - Quilts made January 2020 and after can be entered.
 - Quilts in the 2022 quilt show can be re-entered to allow for judging.
 - Quilts can be from members and non-members.

Treasurer:

- Jackie Sabo shared her screen to review the 2023 Profit and Loss Budget versus Actual overview with the group.
- Jackie explained the complications of showing items where the income or expenses spanned multiple years like membership dues, insurance, CVAN, quilt show, etc. She is moving to an accrual method to make it easier to present the actual income and expenses for a given year. Next year the presentation will be much easier to review.
- Door prize money is now being accounted for in the budget. It was not previously included.
- There was a discussion on Newsletter Ad income and sales as it appears no one is paying. A line item was added to track ad income. The group determined a few ads that run continuously need to be removed. Accurate information from Dee's We're Sew Creative needs to be obtained for future newsletters.
- Jackie shared her screen to review the proposed 2024 Budget.
 - The budget for 2024 was reviewed with the group. Printed copies were provided to the group as well.
 - In lieu of a library book sale, the older books will be donated to the Quilt Show white elephant.
 - There is no facility rental needed now for community outreach so that item was zeroed out for 2024.
 - Hospitality committee has been eliminated so that line item was zeroed out for 2024.
 - The budget income for membership dues is based on an estimate of 80 members.

-
- The membership discussed the CVAN contribution from the 2023 Raffle quilt proceeds. There was a bit of discussion as some members wanted to go back to giving a standard 50% as was done in the past. The net profits from the 2023 quilt were around \$2100. The group settled on \$750 which was approved when the budget was approved. It is likely this will be a point for further discussion for 2024 proceeds.
 - The 2024 budget leaves \$1330 to carry into 2025.

 - Jackie Sabo moved to approve the 2024 budget. Sandra Allred seconded the motion. The 2024 budget was approved.
 - Jackie, Debra, and Carol met at the Pinnacle Bank today to get signature access on the guild accounts.
 - Debra asked for volunteers for the Audit Reviews. Three volunteers stepped up – Emily Davis, Carol Harris, Barbara Horne-Stead.

January Birthday Announcements:

Karen Bronkhurst, Jody Cox, Marguerite Klaiber, Sharon Smith, Alice Spring. Fat quarters were also distributed to the December birthdays as they did not receive their fat quarter during the December party.

Door Prize Drawing: The winner was selected.

Show and Tell: Members were asked to announce their name as they showed their quilt. Activities will now be counting show and tell participation for their annual awards.

Next Membership Meeting: Monday, February 12, 2024, at 6:30 PM. Social time begins at 6:00 PM.

Adjournment: The Membership Meeting was adjourned at 8:37 PM by President Debra Mills.

Activities

Happy February! The Fridge Magnets you are making (you are keeping) should be brought to the February meeting.

We will start the 2024 Challenge Quilt in February. What you need to do to participate is to bring a magazine (it can be a quilting magazine, but it doesn't have to be). We will select a page number, everyone will turn to this page in the magazine, you will create a quilt based on "what YOU see" on this page. You will need to tear the page from the magazine and submit it with your completed quilt. The size of the quilt should be no larger than 100 inches (measure

each side, add the numbers it should be less than 100) i.e. each side could be 25 inches or you could have two sides at 20 and two sides at 30). These quilts are due in June. They will be displayed at the quilt show, they WILL NOT BE JUDGED, and you don't pay to enter this quilt. The entry must be quilted (top batting bottom) otherwise the sky is the limit. I hope you will participate in this fun challenge.

The April activity will be to make a pot holder. There is a twist to what we've done before. We (the activities committee) will give you a piece of thermal batting in an odd shape, you will create a hot pad using this shape. You will keep the potholder - we will NOT swap. We will need to know if you want to participate in this challenge at the February meeting, so that we have the appropriate number of shapes available in March.

As for March, I hope you are working on your UFO's! The first one will be due at the March meeting. If you haven't already signed up, it's not too late. You can turn your form in at the February meeting. You can complete up to 4 UFO's for this challenge, the entry cost is \$1.00 per UFO. When you complete the UFO and bring to show during the designated month, you will receive your \$1.00 back and get your name one time in the kitty drawing. For each UFO you complete you can get your name added to the kitty drawing. In December our kitty was \$70. If you have any questions, ask Julie or Darlene.

Program - March 11

"Trunk Show – Watercolor Quilts"

Janet will provide a brief talk about creating a Watercolor Quilt and a trunk show of some of her creations.

Workshop – March 12 9:30 am – 3:30 pm

“Watercolor Heart Quilt”



Fees - \$30 members / \$45 non-members

This workshop will allow participants to create a quilt suitable as a wall hanging or table topper.

Join Janet in a day of creativity and “stepping outside the box”. Watercolor quilts are her favorite, and she hopes to make them yours as well. She will be guiding you on how to achieve success with fabric choice, blending and design. The Heart is the basic beginner watercolor choice and the easiest way to learn the basics.

Janet will be available any day prior to class to help you, if needed, with fabric selection and to review any basic quilting questions you may have.

Supply List:

- 1 yard of allover floral
- 1 yard of spaced florals
- 1.5 yards of matching background to spaced florals.
- 1 yard for small border and binding (In picture it is the green fabric)
- Optional 6" border will need 1 yard
- 60" square of batting to use as a design wall or Flannel Backed Tablecloth
- Rotary Cutter and Mat
- Scissors
- Non-slip Quilting Rulers (either 2 x 24 or 6 x 24)
- Sewing Machine in good working order with all typical tools and notions
- Seam Ripper
- At least two wound bobbins
- Straight Pins can be brought but are optional



Optional Homework:

For confident beginners, you can precut your allover florals, spaced florals, and background fabric into 2.5" squares before class. Cut 4x 2.5" strips from each allover florals, spaced floral, and background fabric. Sub cut into 2.5" squares. You can always cut more as needed in class. . Janet will go over cutting fabric at the beginning of class.

We have approximately \$7,500 invested in the Coronet and accessories. Our selling price would be negotiable.

I am reaching out because I have decided to purge myself of my last big load of quilt fabric, books, and notions. I have a ton of brand new items from my shop, and those that I have purchased over the years. Ideally, I would like to get \$800 for everything; I am selling this as a lot. It's a lot of wonderful stuff and thought you or someone you know may want this. Much love to all the quilters. Somebody will get a great buy. I will help load it up.
