# Message from the President

## From the President's Desk

I am hoping that everyone enjoyed Kathleen Rountree's presentations. The biggest take away I got from the program is that we are our own worst critics and that hopefully we can be kinder not only to each other but to ourselves. We do amazing jobs of taking fabric, cutting it up, putting it back together in new patterns and then coming up with a quilting plan to create a finished product. We should be proud to show off our quilts and not be worried about our 'mistakes' but instead recognize what we did right. And yes, we can learn from our 'mistakes' for the next quilt.

This month has been a month of 'mistakes' for me and I have been evaluating the phrase "learn from your mistakes" a lot. Most of my mistakes come from getting in a hurry, not reading the directions thoroughly, or a combination of the two. And I do seem to keep repeating those mistakes. Recently I decided to approach learning a little differently. On one completed quilt I realized I had turned a block. I debated accepting it as a character in the quilt, but instead I decided to do the research and found a Donna Jordan YouTube video that walked me through the steps to turn the block. Two hours later my quilt was fixed and I cannot even tell where the turned block was. Lesson learned: I CAN fix even the worst of my mistakes. Next mistake, I had completed 7 out of 35 blocks in my UFO quilt but most of these blocks were too small or points did not meet. I thought about taking those blocks apart and sewing with better seams. I realized I had enough extra fabric to recut the pieces. I cut new pieces and remade all the problem blocks. Lesson learned: my TIME is worth more than fabric. Last lesson was that I had bought a kit for a new purse, and it did not take long before I realized that I had cut a piece too small and did not have enough fabric to recut the piece. I thought about trying to find a fabric match and then looked in my stash for a suitable fabric. I realized that I liked the new fabric better because it was easier to match the seams. Lesson learned: sometimes mistakes happen for a reason, and we should EMBRACE them.

Recently I read an article about a market study for quilt shops. The study identified that the average quilter is over 60 and starts 10-12 quilting projects a year. But nowhere in that study did they identify how many were completed each year. Now I realized that while I fit the average age, I start more than 12 projects a year, right now I have 5 at various stages in my room. Now most of the projects I start will be finished this year, but I have noticed my biggest problem is getting fabric and pattern and adding it to the stack of future projects. Do those count as UFOs? I have finished my UFO for March and I am looking forward to seeing all of the other completed UFOs.

# Meeting Minutes (February 12, 2024).

**Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by President Debra Mills at 6:30 PM.

## **Speaker Presentation:**

Kathleen Rountree spoke to the group on Quilt Judging and show operations. She showed quilt samples for discussion. She walked the group through what to look for with piecing, quilting, and binding. She prefers a positive approach to judging quilts. Remember - the quilt is being judged, not the quilter. Members that brought quilts were asked to apply her judging principles to their own quilt. The book "Essentials of Quilt Judging" by Lorraine Covington was available for sale. She recommended a video by Bonnie Browning on how to fold a quilt for shipping.

**Welcome Visitors:** Two visitors attended the meeting. Marcia Noles and Terry Moore.

## **Membership:**

There were 43 members present at the meeting. 3 members joined the meeting on Zoom. Two members joined. Jacinto Walker and Cathy Gordon-Hallman (returning member).

Terry Patterson reminded everyone to double check the information on the membership list when signing in since this will be used to create the guild directory. This is also the last chance to send a new or updated picture to Terry.

## **Approval of January 2024 Minutes:**

Two changes were needed to the January 8, 2024, meeting minutes. The Budget for 2024 will show a net loss of \$1300 per Jackie Sabo. The budget in the newsletter for January was a draft budget. The corrected and final 2024 budget was sent via email to all members prior to this meeting. Melba Mick moved to approve the January 8, 2024, membership meeting minutes with amendments. Barbara Horne-Stead seconded the motion.

## **Treasurer:**

Carol Harris spoke about the recent audit and changes that will be made. Documentation including receipts will be needed for any reimbursement requests, price tags will not be accepted as documentation. Jackie Sabo will be creating a new form that must be filled out by anyone requesting reimbursements or funds. No checks will be written on membership meeting nights. Plan by calling or emailing Jackie in advance of the meeting and have the form ready to submit. Two board members will be required to sign all reimbursement requests as a safety measure.

## **Outreach:**

Carol Harris announced there are cut out bear kits available in sets of fives and singles. When taking the bears to sew please sign the sheet. If you need instructions for sewing emailed to you, make sure to put down your email address. Bears should have an ID tag ironed on one of the feet. Ask Carol for the iron on tag. You may find it easier to iron on the tag prior to sewing and stuffing.

The guild received thank you letters from CCM and CVAN.

When dropping off donation quilts to Carol, make sure you are marked off the list before leaving the table. You will need to iron on the label before turning in the quilt. Identify which charity you choose on the tag. Leave the charity blank on the label if you want Carol to choose the appropriate charity.

## **Programs:**

There are still openings available for the February program with Kathleen Rountree.

The March program is a watercolor heart quilt using three fabrics that blend hosted by Janet-Marie Gillan. The supply list was included in the February newsletter and will be in the March newsletter again. Janet showed a sample of one of her quilts. Members that have already done one of her classes can choose to do either the wreath or the cross pattern during the class.

The April program is Embracing Curves with Quilters Gallery.

## **Raffle Quilt:**

Sandra Allred announced tickets for the 2024 raffle quilt are being sold at Dee's We're Sew Creative on March 29 from 10-4. A request to sell at the Capital Quilts Show in Raleigh is pending for March 15-16. Salisbury Quilt Show is pending confirmation for a day in early May. A sign-up sheet will be available for those interested as each date is confirmed. You can sell your own tickets at these events if you wish.

Pick up your tickets to sell from Julie or Darlene if you have not received yours yet.

Raffle Quilt for 2025 – a chair and committee are still needed.

## **Activities:**

Julie Love asked members to show their Quilt Magnets.

Julie had a member select a page for the Challenge Quilt. Page 23 was chosen. Members should tear out the magazine page (or take a photo of the page and print it in color.) Members must turn in their challenge quilt along with the magazine page. Challenge quilts are due at the June

meeting and will be collected for the quilt show. Remember you need to fill out a Registration Form for the quilt submission. Challenge quilts are free to submit.

Julie reviewed upcoming activities which will be noted in the newsletter as well as the website. For March your first UFO is due. April will be a Hot Pad made in a specific shape provided by the activities committee. May will be a 'Do Not Touch' mini quilt. These mini quilts will be collected and retained for use in the guild quilt shows. Samples of these can be found on the guild Facebook page or Julie can send you samples.

### **Quilt Show Update:**

Sandra Allred discussed the status of the quilt show planning.

- Two vendors have contracts submitted. Two more are in the works.
- If members know of a group like Avon sales or something not necessarily quilt related that may be interesting to attendees of quilt shows, please provide Sandra the information.
- Some vendors are unable to attend due to staff issues.
- There is room for two other guilds to sell their raffle tickets. Two guilds are interested but want to sell only 1 day since they are coming so far. This may be an option to allow two others to sell tickets as well. More to come on this.

Debra Mills reviewed the quilt submission forms with the guild. Printed forms were provided to the members to review and ask questions.

- Registration Form for show quilts is available on the guild website.
- Quilts made after January 2020 will be accepted.
- Quilts receiving a viewer's choice award at the previous show can be entered.
- Splash of Color was defined.
- Members may submit unlimited quilts but only two per category for judging. All other quilts over 2 in a category must be in the Display Only category.
- Registration Forms will be accepted at the April and May Meetings.
- A picture is needed for each quilt submitted for insurance purposes. The picture can be submitted when the quilt is turned in.

Terry Patterson is accepting items for the Silent Auction now. Like the last show, they will have a booth for selling quilts, wall hangings, and table runners. They need quilts, wall hangings and table runners for the auction portion as well. Please bring any items to the membership meeting. If you have questions, please send Terry an email.

Charlotte Doyle announced she is putting baskets together for the basket raffle. She needs new, unused items. If you have items that you think would be useful for these baskets, please bring them to the membership meeting. Someone has donated four Longaberger baskets. More baskets will be needed.

Julie Love oversees the White Elephant room this year. Like the last show, items will be collected on set up day.

- Members are asked to bring gently used items.
- Members need to measure fabric and mark on masking tape the size. The sizes are to be measured generously. 8 inches is not a quarter yard. 10 inches is a quarter yard. Don't price the fabric since it will be sold by size.
- Only quilting fabric will be accepted. No clothing, drapery or non-quilt fabric will be collected.
- All non-fabric items donated should be priced. One third of retail was suggested.
- Accepting kits, books, magazines, fabrics, and notions. Magazines must be from the last 5 years. No older magazines can be accepted.
- If you have questions, reach out to Julie.

### **Door Prize Drawing:**

The basket winner was Carol Diaz.

### **Show and Tell:**

Members were asked to announce their name as they showed their quilt. Activities will now be counting show and tell participation for their annual awards.

**Adjournment:** The Membership Meeting was adjourned at 8:28 PM by President Debra Mills.

## March Program and Workshop

Janet-Marie Gillan is an experienced quilter and will be demonstrating her technique for Watercolor Quilt.

### Program - March 11

#### "Trunk Show – Watercolor Quilts"

Janet will provide a brief talk about creating a Watercolor Quilt and a trunk show of some of her creations.

### Workshop – March 12      9:30 am – 3:30 pm

#### “Watercolor Heart Quilt”



Fees - \$30 members / \$45 non-members

This workshop will allow participants to create a quilt suitable as a wall hanging or table topper.

Join Janet in a day of creativity and “stepping outside the box”. Watercolor quilts are her favorite, and she hopes to make them yours as well. She will be guiding you on how to achieve success with fabric choice, blending and design. The Heart is the basic beginner watercolor choice and the easiest way to learn the basics.

Janet will be available any day prior to class to help you, if needed, with fabric selection and to review any basic quilting questions you may have.

#### Supply List:

- 1 yard of allover floral
- 1 yard of spaced florals
- 1.5 yards of matching background to spaced florals.
- 1 yard for small border and binding (In picture it is the green fabric)
- Optional 6" border will need 1 yard
- 60" square of batting to use as a design wall or Flannel Backed Tablecloth
- Rotary Cutter and Mat

Scissors

Non-slip Quilting Rulers (either 2 x 24 or 6 x 24)

Sewing Machine in good working order with all typical tools and notions

Seam Ripper

At least two wound bobbins

Straight Pins can be brought but are optional

### **Optional Homework:**

For confident beginners, you can precut your allover florals, spaced florals, and background fabric into 2.5" squares before class. Cut 4x 2.5" strips from each allover florals, spaced floral, and background fabric. Sub cut into 2.5" squares. You can always cut more as needed in class. Janet will go over cutting fabric at the beginning of class.

## **April 2024**

Quilters Gallery, aka "The Pizza Girls" will bring their experience and talents in quilting in April. In addition to the program, they will set up an area to sell patterns, rulers and quilt fabrics.

Program – April 8

"Show and Tell"

Quilters Gallery brings their current selection of quilts and quilt tops, usually about 50 or more for our pleasure. Some are samples of current patterns and some are their original designs. As they go through the quilts, they discuss color, creative fabric use and simple border treatments along with lots of tips and tricks that they have learned in the past 25+ years.

Workshop – April 9 9:30 am – 3:30 pm **"Embrace the Curves"**

Skill level: Confident beginner or intermediate.

Everyone loves the look of curves in a quilt, but often it is a technique that scares quilters. Workshop will cover Rainbow Curves, Wheel of Mystery and Winner's Bouquet block. All attendees will need to buy the kit (\$9). The kit will include all pieces pre-cut, ready to sew. No need to buy the ruler unless you like the technique.

Fees - \$30 members / \$45 non-members

\$9.00 kit w/ 3 different curved blocks.
