From the President's Desk

This month we decided to visit relatives. That meant a trip to visit Tennessee, West Virginia, and Florida. We were able to have enough time to visit some quilt shops near some of the relatives and I learned not to judge a quilt shop by its exterior. Now my goal was to visit and learn what the stores had and NOT GROW my stash. The first shop was in the back of a strip mall and I was greeted with "Welcome to Granny B's. We are doing Christmas in July, 25% off the entire store". I managed to resist most of their fabric but did find some cute fabric in clearance that will be perfect for the pillowcases at \$6 a yard. Next store was an old stand alone store with potholes in the parking lot that could eat our SUV. My husband felt I would be in and out in less than two minutes. I went in and there were several tables at the front stacked high with flat cuts and bolts of fabric and then aisles of fabric in the back. I looked at the first table of Moda, batiks, and other brands and the sign said \$6.99 a yard and I thought this is a good sale. My mistake, that it was the most expensive fabric in the store. This shop was owned by a mother and her daughter for over 40 years and they were extremely friendly. I broke and ended up buying over 20 yards of fabric for only \$120. The fabric was all quality brands but just a little older than what I see in other stores. The third store was in the downtown of a small town and looked very nice, but none of the fabric looked exciting to me but it was interesting because they seemed to carry a lot of the older themed fabrics as the shelves were labeled by decades in some areas. I was able to resist buying any fabric in this store. So my "lessons learned" is to investigate all opportunities, even if the first impression may be negative. And to have my samples with me of my projects that I need fabric to finish with me at all times just in case I run into another Ingrams with blenders at \$4.99 a yard.

Now that we have voted to hold the Quilt Show again in 2025, it is time to start the planning. The first step will be to evaluate the categories for judging. For the past couple of shows, this guild has done function (bed, wall) and size. The judges recommended that we consider switching to technique (pieced, applique, machine embroidery, mixed) and size. We can also add special categories such as panels. What I have learned from doing this is that we as a guild determine the rules for our categories, so if for machine embroidery we want to allow false backs then we can write that into the rules for that category. The judging results are better when quilts are compared like to like, our goal is to determine the best way to arrange this for our Guild. If you would like to serve on the committee, reach out to Carol Harris or myself. I will be providing the breakdown from this year as well as samples of entry forms from other Guilds to get ideas of how others have handled the categories.

It is time to start considering our committees for next year. A few committee chairs have reached out to me to indicate they are ready for a change. We need to consider the future of the library within the Guild. It is not used extensively right now and does require that either we spend the money to update it, or we disband it and sell the current books. Let me know your thoughts. We will talk about this in August during the meeting. Are there other committees that we need to revise their roles or discontinue? I will be reaching out to committee chairs in August to determine those that are ready to change and those that want to continue in the role for another year.

Meeting Minutes

Cabarrus Quilters Guild Membership Meeting Minutes Monday, July 8, 2024

The June Guild meeting was called to order by President Debra Mills at 6:30 PM.

Program:

The program was given by Elsa Karl-Newbauer – A Trunk Show on Quiltworx paper piecing technique. She was trained at the Quiltworx center in Kalispell, Montana. Quiltworx is run by Judy Niemeyer and her family. Elsa has been quilting since the 70s. She embarked on her Quiltworx journey in 2015 with her first class at the Asheville shop hop. After attending the Quiltworx center in Montana 3 times, she was asked by Judy to train as a certified instructor. She visits Montana frequently to learn new Judy Niemeyer techniques. Many of her quilts are the cover quilts for some of the patterns. Elsa spent most of her program showing the various quilts she made while giving quilting tips along the way. Program completed at 7:19 PM.

Post Program – Pre Break:

Raffle Basket contents were revealed.

Members were reminded to buy raffle basket tickets, sign up for Programs, and sign up to bring a dish for the August Picnic during the break.

Sandra Allred reviewed the status of the Raffle Quilt sales. There are no sales pending but she is following up with several indoor locations including Yadkin Valley Quilts, Azalea in Mooresville, and a few area breweries.

Carol Eicher announced her book signing at Barnes and Noble in Concord on Saturday, July 13. This book is not a quilting book, but an inspirational book based on her husband's heart journey.

Meeting Break from 7:24 to 7:35 PM.

Approval of June 2024 Minutes:

No changes were needed. Motion to approve was made by Melba Mick and it was seconded by Marguerite Klaiber. The motion passed.

Membership: Total meeting attendance: 70 (69 in person and 1 Zoom). 1 new member and 7 visitors.

Quilt Show Updates:

Sandra began the show updates. Estimate of 400-450 attendees. Steps will be taken next show to get an exact count. Vendors were very happy. The space was nice. They commented on the friendly members. One negative was the need for more signs to get attendees to the back of the school. The vendors really appreciated supplying lunches and snacks.

Carol Harris mentioned the Mooresville guild was still talking at their meeting earlier in the day about how nice the show was and the friendliness of the members.

Debra heard many comments on the great quality of the quilts submitted.

Jackie Sabo reviewed the financials from the show. Gross was approximately \$15,000. Expenses were around \$5,4000. The show netted \$9,500. It costs the guild \$1,600 a year to store pipe/drape/bins for the show.

Debra announced participant numbers. 183 quilts submitted. 157 quilts were judged. 53 individuals entered quilts. 39 entrants received at least 1 ribbon. Category changes are in the works for the next show based on judges' recommendations.

Debra discussed the next show. The next show will be at WCHS. We maxed out on poles and drapes at this show. The question presented to the group was to vote on whether we have a show next year or wait until 2026. Some concerns of members were losing vendors if we don't have a show next year. Debra has agreed to be the next show chair. Sandra will work to obtain the vendors and sponsors. Carol Harris will work the judging to include working with a committee to revamp the categories and submission form.

Members were asked to vote on holding a Quilt Show in 2025. The membership voted unanimously to have a show again in June of 2025.

Community Outreach:

Carol Harris said they have 131 bears to deliver. She will not be at Fire Station 9 this Friday but it will still be open to anyone who wants to come and work on their charity projects. Carol announced she needs to find a replacement for outreach next year as she focuses on the show and judging. If anyone is interested, let Carol and Debra know. This person can work with Carol now to learn while she is still available.

Announcements:

Charity Sew is this Friday, July 12, at Fire Station 9 in Concord from 9AM to 3PM. Come out and sew any charity project. Charlotte will be available to teach you how to sew the burrito style pillow cases if you have not seen this method.

Quilts of Valor will accept blocks next month. Many members turned in their blocks this month as requested. Many blocks were presented to Ona this month.

Debra and Sandra showed the story from the Independent Tribune on our quilt show. If anyone wants a copy, send Sandra an email and she can send you a picture of the story.

Janet-Marie Gillan works at Dee's We're Sew Creative. If there are any members interested in teaching there, please contact Dee at the store. Several of our members teach or have taught there.

Upcoming Programs:

July's program Tuesday, July 9, is presented by Elsa. There are still slots available.

August is the guild picnic so there is no formal program. Make sure to sign up to bring a salad. Your activity for the month is a pillowcase for charity. Tuesday in August will be an open sew day at the church.

September's program is Rope Bowls presented by Carol Harris.

Final Business:

- July Birthdays were announced, and birthday members were given a fat quarter. Debra Mills, Rosey Stein, Emily Davis, Barbara Horne-Stead, Mary Ann McEachem, Tracey Galman, Delores Swarts, and Jamie.
- Raffle basket drawing winner was drawn.
- Show & Tell was held and members received credit with Activities for participating.
- The meeting was adjourned at 8:20 PM.

In September, Carol Harris will be teaching us Rope Bowls. The program on September 9 will be a trunk show and description of the process. The Workshop on September 10 will be making our own Rope Bowl. Carol will be supplying the rope, participants will need to supply the fat eighth or scraps they want to use in the making of the bowl.

Workshop – September 10 9:30 am – 3:30 pm

Have you ever wanted to have an attractive container that was unbreakable? Rope bowls to the rescue! Rope bowls work everywhere. Kids have a hard time learning “don’t touch”. No worries with rope bowls. A little rope, maybe some fabric, denim needle and some time at your sewing machine you have a one-of-a-kind gift. Just like a quilt, size & color is up to you. Join me for the workshop ready to play.

Carol will supply the rope. Participants Supply list:

- Zig zag sewing machine with neutral thread
- Denim needle (suggest an extra needle just in case of breakage)
- 4 straight pins
- Fabric – fat 1/8 minimum (9” x 22”) or scraps for a scrappy look. I prefer batik because it frays the least. Amount of fabric depends on how much fabric you want on your bowl.

Fees: \$40 for members / \$55 for non-members

In October we will be having Carole Carter (From My Carolina Home, <https://frommycarolinahome.com>) talk about scrap management, called Scrap Dancing. For the Workshop on October 15, we will be doing a scrappy table runner called To the Nines.
