From the President's Desk

From the President's Desk

I had a column written that included talking about the generosity of our members and strategies to identify additional donation opportunities. However, events in the last week have changed our priorities to how we help our families, friends, and even individuals we do not know who have been impacted by Hurricane Helene. We have been trying to identify the best ways to help, whether it is the quilting community, or the impacted regions in general.

Within the quilting community, Angie from 5 Little Monkeys talked about the financial impact of the closing of the Asheville Quilt Show and closing the shop during the Shop Hop. While some may feel that there are other more important concerns right now, but for the survival of many of these Local Quilt Shops this could be the one of the final straws. So Angie recommended that if possible to "shop the shops" in Western North Carolina, Eastern Tennessee or other impacted areas, online or buy gift certificates for use at a future time (or not if you just want to donate to the shop). She said to have patience as many of the stores need to get power back, have roads for staff to get to the shops, or even have carriers to pick up the packages, but any of the impacted shops will love to have the service. There is a list of shops in the region elsewhere in the newsletter. We do not know if each shop has been impacted by Helene, but is a starting list for options to help local quilt shops. For those who want to do something more concrete, one option is **Operation Airdrop** (www.https://www.operation-airdrop.com/) to deliver critical materials to those in need. This particular operation is a coalition of private pilots to provide needed services to those with damaged roads. The above address provides information on needed products (no water as it is too heavy for the planes) but numerous other products as well as their collection point at the WalMart on Thunder Road, Concord. If you would prefer to donate cash to their efforts. Another option is Samaritan's Purse, however the website was down while I was trying to write this column. When choosing the size of borders for your quilt, you might want to use The Golden Ratio in QuiltingThe ratio, in its simplest form, is **1.6 to 1**. This is applied so that each border should be 1.6 times larger than the previous one. For example, if the first border is 2", the next is 3.25" (rounding number to the nearest 1/4" makes cutting nicer). These are finished widths. (Google search)

Connie: Tom and I have delivered 78 place mats to Meals on Wheels. They have over 300 clients so we would like to come close to that number by the end of the year. I know that is a tall order but use some of your orphan blocks and easy blocks. This is a good project for practicing quilting. There is no size requirement. Just make it big enough to use as a place mat, not a mug mat. Happy quilting and thank you.

Carol: The guild has been contacted by the Southwest Cabarrus Rotary Club (Harrisburg). Their mission is Alzheimer's research but also help those suffering from Alzheimer's Disease. I met with the group & they are seeking a group to make Fidget Quilts. These quilts need to have textures, "do dads" for lack of a better word – zippers, buttons, strings. Something to keep the patient's hands busy. They would collect the quilts & in turn distribute them in Cabarrus County, such as emergency room, nursing homes. Is this something the guild would be interested in? Think about it & we can discuss at the meeting.


