From the President's Desk

This month I actually completed quilt tops. I finished both of the baby quilts that jumped my project line as well as the 2024 Brown Bag Mystery Quilt I started at the retreat from last month as well as the Cubed Project top from our workshop this month. I am not sure I dented my 'project' stack that much, but it felt good to move it from the ziploc bag to the 'completed top' stack. Next up is to tackle the completed top stack and turn those into completed quilts.

During November I took on the challenge of cleaning up and reorganizing my sewing room. I have three dressers, a plastic drawer storage unit, and some bookshelves in the room. One of the dressers (8 drawers with an oversized top) came with the house and I used it to store fabric and the top was perfect for organizing rulers, patterns, and other tools.. However I have found out that precuts are very heavy and the poor old dresser drawers were literally falling apart under the weight of the fabric. So after a lot of research and watching videos, I bought two wire shelving units (think kitchen shelving) and moved the contents of the old dresser and the plastic drawers into clear bins of a variety of sizes, including several smaller bins that will serve as project bins. I covered two shelves with old cutting mats so I could put all of the items that had been on top of the dresser onto these shelves. I am hoping that this improves my chances of finding the fabric when I need it, but at least I won't find ball bearings mixed in with my fabric now. The downside of this is I counted the number of projects that needed boxes, I am at 16 right now. What are strategies that you find successful for organizing your projects and stash?

Also during this month I have been watching and reading about progress in Western North Carolina. I enjoyed watching the videos of Angie Lattimore of Five Little Monkeys as she talked about the Fabric Hugs (quilts) that her shop is giving out. Bittersweet Quilts in Minnesota gathered quilts and brought over 800 quilts to Angie and with the quilts that she had collected they had over 1,000 quilts that were handed out on November 18th and 19th. Carole Carter (From My Carolina Home) is working with the Guild in Hendersonville and they are delivering quilts to Bat Cave and Chimney Rock. It is getting cold in the mountains, quilts are still needed to keep people warm and a Fabric Hug is always needed to make someone realize that people care.

This hack comes from Quilters Anonymous. Don't use steam to set your seams. Use a mister instead. When you steam, you run the chance of stretching or distorting your fabric. Plus leaving water in your iron decreases the life of the iron. The mister is better than a spray bottle in that the fine mist dampens the seam instead of wetting it. Volunteers Needed


