From the President's Desk

Happy New Year! Now the normal column would be to talk about my New Year's resolutions for 2025. But in case you have not noticed, I have a tendency to be a Type A personality and have found it is best if I make generalized lists or I go crazy trying to get my resolutions finished. So my resolutions for this year are:

- Try new things
- Have fun
- Done is better than perfect

Now this is a totally doable list for me. I have found that hanging around the members of the Quilt Guild is helping with meeting these resolutions. I have learned so many new things over the past year and had a great deal of fun while doing that. I am getting better at the "done is better than perfect". After a year of hanging around this group, my definition of "perfect" is changing, and I understand it is okay to change strategy mid-quilt. I have just started on the blocks for my Quilt as You Go Block of the Month and I quilted the first two pieced-blocks. The blocks looked very nice (points matched and colors were well balanced), my quilting was actually okay, but I realized I was unhappy with the backing as I had white thread on a deep purple fabric. And the more I looked at the block the more I realized that I had only finished two out of 25 blocks and now was the time to change it. Yes, I went out and bought a white on white that I can use for the backing and I will remake the first two blocks (that will be faster than taking out all of that quilting). In the past I would have just tucked this into my UFO stack because I was unhappy with it, but If I change the strategy I will get it done. We will see what I say when I start the very detailed applique blocks.

This month is the Business Meeting. I hope that everyone will join us for this meeting as it will be setting the strategy for the coming year. We will be discussing the budget for the coming year, how much do we allocate to programs, to CVAN, to Outreach, etc. We will also be discussing our Outreach partners for this year. In 2024 we provided quilts to Jeff Gordon's Children's Hospital, Atrium NICU, and Hospice. And all of our partners have appreciated our quilts. Do we want to maintain these partners or are there other groups in need of the quilts our talented members make? Our requirements are the quilts must stay in Cabarrus county and we would like groups that accept a variety of sizes.

I would like to remind everyone that we will be doing an Open Sew on Tuesday, Jan 14, from 9:30 - 3:30. One member has asked if I could help her with Quilt as You Go Sashing so if anyone wants to come join us for a casual styled lesson bring a minimum of 6 blocks no smaller than 10 inch square that are quilted and some fabric to make sashing stips from and we will complete either a table topper (3 across, 2 deep) or the start of a quilt. So you will have the option of working on your own project or working on a Quilt as You Go Project. If you have any questions on the QAYG, please let me know.

These hacks come from The Quilting Channel. "7 Major Hacks for Quilting". Two hacks caught my attention. I always have trouble sewing a straight ¼" seam. My attention tends to wander which leads to a mess. Using your regular sewing foot (not your quarter inch foot), move the needle to the right. And if that doesn't work, there are magnetic seam guides sold at Amazon for less than \$10. I'll try those and let you know.

Hack #2. Use a carpenter's ruler instead of your measuring tape. The ruler folds nicely and stays straight better than any others I have seen. Definitely trying this one.
