### From the President's Desk

This month I am reminded of the traits of being a quilter - specifically determination. Typically, when I talked to my mother about my latest quilting project, and usually my oops of the day, she would respond that I don't know how you have that much patience. I looked at not so much as patience but determination. I am frequently determined that I will learn a new skill and not quit halfway there. I will admit that I have UFOs that may stay UFOs forever because I did not enjoy the pattern or the process, but I spent enough time learning the process to know that I could do it if I had to. This month, my husband graciously offered to set up my new Grace frame and Qnique machine for me. This weekend I started the process of learning to use the machine. And that is where the determination comes in as I learned to troubleshoot the issues with the machine. We do not want to count how many times the thread broke, and I watched another video on tension, thread breaking, until the magic video on how to properly put in the bobbin. Then sorting out the skipping stitches issue, more videos until we got to the one on resolving the encoder issue. Now these are traits that I find in most of the quilters I have met whether it is problem solving a pattern issue, developing a new pattern, or solving the issues with our 'power tools', I think this is a pretty amazing and talented group of people.

I have seen some beautiful quilts at Show and Tell recently that hopefully will be in the Quilt Show. I have already identified the two for the panel category and need to finish two more for the piecing category. I am planning to start my challenge quilt next week. I really like the challenge the Activities committee has developed, and I have been looking at what fabric I want to use. How are your plans for your entries coming along?

I will admit that I am happy that our program this month does not require a new ruler as I really don't need another new ruler right now. I saw the sample that Brenda Smith made for the Coloring Book Collage, and it looks awesome. Now to choose my pattern and identify my fabrics. And I am hoping that somewhere in my stash I have enough scraps to do my collage.

Speaking of stash, our May workshop will be Carole Carter, From My Carolina Home. I have been reading her blog on how to manage and reduce your stash. She has a technique to measure fabric out and fabric in, with the goal that each month more goes out than comes in unless the in is for a specific project. And I feel good about my purchases because there are also months she buys fabric just because. I have identified several fabrics in my stash for pillowcases for the April activity, that may balance out the fabric I bought last month, even though I said I was not going to buy any more. Carole will be doing a trunk show about her patterns called Scrap Dancing and will be teaching the pattern "To The Nines" Tablerunner. And no special ruler is needed.

I frequently finish a top and then put it in a stack waiting to be quilted. At this point I normally have a plan for the binding, a fabric from the quilt top or perhaps two fabrics planning to do a flange binding. But I will then clean up my space by putting all of the leftover fabric into a bin. However, by the time I quilt the top, I have to search for the binding fabric or worse I used it on another quilt forgetting that I had a plan for it. Now I put the binding fabric or strips into a ziploc bag and safety pin it to the quilt or put both the quilt top and the binding fabric in a large ziploc bag. This has saved so much time when I finally get around to quilting that top.

## **QUILT SHOW**

We start accepting entry forms at the April meeting and will accept forms until the May meeting. We will have entry forms at the meeting. You can go to <a href="Microsoft Word - 2025">Microsoft Word - 2025</a> Registration and Entry Form 11-18 to print the form. My suggestion is print just the first page for as many quilts as you plan to enter, and then print the rules just once as a separate set of pages. This will save paper but also means that not only can you write additional information on the back of the form, but you can tape your quilt picture to the back of your entry page. What if your entry is not finished when you turn in your form? Turn in the picture when you turn in the quilt. Why is this important? This helps the

judging committee, during the last judging day we had one quilt out of order in the stack and because we had the picture we were able to quickly locate it and continue with the judging of that category. Have a question on the rules and what you can enter? Contact Carol Harris or Debra Mills.
