

Cabarrus Quilters' Guild Membership Meeting Agenda

Monday, April 13, 2026

The April 2026 membership meeting was called to order by President Wendy Moffitt at 6:30pm.

Approval of Minutes:

The March 2026 Membership Meeting Minutes were approved as presented. Lisa Edwards made a motion to approve, and it was seconded by Janet Gillan. Approved by voice vote.

Program:

Sandra Allred introduced Cheryl Brickey from Meadow Mist Designs from Greenville, SC. Cheryl started quilting around 15 years ago when her children were small. She heard a quote "Everyone should do something every day that can't be undone" and decided to try quilting. She decided to write a book with a friend on Modern Plus Sign Quilts, but this did not sell well. She realized she has a lot of charm packs and developed the concept for Charm Pack Quilts book. Each quilt used one charm pack and two fabrics, which she called the "hamburger helper" of charm packs. This book was a bestseller. She answered some questions on how to find a publisher. All of her books were published with C&T Publishing, but she recommended anyone interested in getting a book published to go to QuiltCon or other large conferences and meet with publishers, then develop a proposal and work back and forth to concept. She then did a trunk show of many of her quilts and for the ones from patterns in the latest book she showed the same pattern with light and dark backgrounds.

Membership:

1 New Member. 4 Guests. 2 on Zoom. 49 Members in Person.

Door Prize:

The door prize consists of a large pot with seeds, 2 panels, some coordinating fabrics, and a pair of scissors.

T-Shirts:

Debra Mills talked about the plan for T-Shirts with the Splash of Color Logo. Quotes were obtained from Southern Signature Designs and ColorInk. A third company was identified but had gone out of business. Southern Signature Designs was cheaper by \$9 per shirt than ColorInk. They will be using Gildan T-Shirts. The Board had recommended to use Southern Signature Designs. They will be available at \$15 pre-order, \$20 purchase June meeting and Quilt Show.

Then the next question was the color choices. Printed samples were provided for Gray, Lavender, Light Blue, and Green. The top votes were for Lavender and Light Blue. Members can pre-order starting during the break.

Programs:

Sandra Allred addressed programs for 2026.

April – Ten members are signed up for the program; there is still space for additional attendees.

May – Sulky Thread will be presenting a workshop on Free Motion Quilting. The technique will involve printing a pattern on wash away stabilizer. The cost of the workshop will be \$30 Workshop for members / \$20 for a kit / \$5 for a kit with only the stabilizer. A sample was shown of the finished wall-hanging. Five members are currently signed up.

June – This will be Quilt Show preparation

Jackie Sabo talked about the retreat in August. One space has opened on the retreat. Interested members should contact Jackie.

Community Outreach:

Debra Mills announced that she had received a call from Levine Cancer Institute asking for quilts for patients. She would be dropping off some quilts on April 15th.

Activities:

Wendy Moffitt announced that the Bunny Ears Bags collected in March were taken to the Children's Home and were greatly appreciated.

Since Marsha Petrin had a family emergency, members were asked to check in their wristlets on the sheet and any they wanted to contribute would be supplied to be sold at the Quilt Show. Janneke had the envelopes with paint chips for the May activity, to make a 10 inch block using the colors of the paint chips. The collected blocks will be used to make donation quilt(s).

2026 Raffle Quilt:

Jackie Sabo discussed raffle quilt sales. We will have both May 1 and 2 at the Salisbury Quil Show. A Sign-Up Genius invitation has been sent to members for shifts during the show. Sandra Allred will be the coordinator for the show. There is a possibility of doing the Catawba Quilt Show in Hickory on April 18. Jackie will let everyone know if she gets information on this. We will be working the Garage Sale at Sewing in Carolina on May 30.

Sandra Allred has announced she will chair the 2027 Raffle Quilt. The quilt is being done as a Round Robin so members that volunteered have been assigned their months...

2026 Quilt Show:

Debra Mills talked about our Splash of Color Quilt Show. Entry Forms are live through the link on the website, A link was sent to all members.

The Bonitz site is not available for judging this year. Options identified so far are the Community Meeting Room at Firehouse #9 at a cost of \$300 or a church in Charlotte at no cost but a 40-minute drive from Harrisburg. The Harrisburg Presbyterian Church is not available. If anyone knows of other potential options such as a church, senior center, club house at a subdivision, please let Debra know.

Volunteer forms will be available at the May and June meetings and also posted on Sign Up Genius. We will be looking for many volunteers, especially husbands, sons, grandsons or friends to assist during set-up day. We are looking a new Admissions Chair as Carol Eicher will be travelling during the Show. Carol talked about the duties for Admissions Chair.

Jackie Sabo raised the question on if additional Guild or Splash of Color pins were needed. Debra Mills will check the storage area and report back on the current number of pins.

Miscellaneous Business:

The door prize drawing was won by Natalie D'Aiello.

Wendy Moffitt announced committee vacancies, which include the Picnic, and Christmas Party. If no chair for Picnic by the June meeting, the August meeting will be just a standard meeting.

The By-Laws Committee will be Sandra Allred, Connie Richardson, and Janneke Bahoman. They are looking for a few more members. The By-Laws were rewritten a few years ago so hopefully if each committee member reviews a few sections of the By-Laws it should not take too long to complete the review.

April birthdays were announced. Fat quarters were available for these members.

Wendy Moffitt. asked everyone to help put away chairs at the end of the meeting. This will help prevent one or two people trying to return the room to the way we found it before leaving.

The last event of the evening was showing Show & Tell by members and our guests.
