

Cabarrus Quilters' Guild Membership Meeting Agenda

Monday, June 8, 2026

The June 2026 membership meeting was called to order by President Wendy Moffitt at 6:31pm. Approval of Minutes:

Jackie Sabo presented a correction to the minutes that the income made at the Salisbury Quilt Show was \$393. The June 2026 Membership Meeting Minutes were approved with correction. Sandra Olden made a motion to approve, and it was seconded by Karen Bronkhorst. Approved by voice vote.

Program:

There was no program as the focus is on Quilt Show Prep

Membership:

2 Guests. 1 on Zoom. 54 Members in Person, 83 total members.

Door Prize:

The door prize was themed around July 4th with 4 yards of fabric, a small vacuum cleaner, a pot holder and other items.

Cabarrus Firemen Association

Matthew Ford with the Cabarrus County Firemen Association contacted Wendy Moffitt about potentially donating a quilt to assist with their fundraising efforts. They would like to do a raffle during the 2026 Cabarrus County Fair and are looking for a patriotic themed quilt to recognize both the 250th anniversary of the US and the 25th anniversary of 9/11. Wendy asked the members for ideas on how to meet this request. Colleen Sain responded that QOV had a lap sized quilt that could not be awarded through their program due to size but she would be willing to donate to support this organization.

Treasurer

Wendy announced that Mary Jo Ward had submitted her resignation effective July 1. Wendy read the By-Laws relating to resignations of officers during their term. She then announced that Julie Love Freeman had volunteered for the position and per the By-Laws the Executive Board was polled to approve or deny the position. The Board voted 6 – 0 to approve Julie for the position.

Programs:

Sandra Allred addressed programs for 2026.

July will be working on quilts for QOV.

August will be planned by Wendy for the members not attending the retreat.

September will be Margaret James on Art Quilt Design. She will bring all materials for the workshop so members can try the techniques before purchasing supplies.

Jackie Sabo talked about the retreat in August. Two spaces have opened on the retreat. Interested members should contact Jackie. All members attending the retreat should talk with Jackie about room preferences.

QOV

Colleen Sain talked about having kits to make the QOV block of the year and members could pick up a kit from her. If members are making their own quilt blocks not from the kits, then need to either make 17 blocks or make kits to make a total of 17 blocks that have the same center. The blocks will be used around panels and it is preferred if all blocks match for a panel. Quilts will be assembled during the July Workshop on July 14.

Community Outreach:

Karen Bronkhorst reminded members to turn in their quilts to meet membership requirements. Debra Mills reported that David Buskey had reached out about getting the contract signed for use of the meeting room at Fire Station #9. Debra will meet with him at the Charity Sew on Friday, June 12 to finalize the contract. .

2026 Raffle Quilt:

Jackie Sabo discussed raffle quilt sales. The Yard Sale at Sewing in Carolina was successful. The next sale will be August 29.

Sandra Allred discussed that the 2027 Round Robin quilt is ahead of schedule. Ann Weaver is currently working on Month 8 of the quilt.

Activities:

Marsha Petrin thanked members for turning in the color chip blocks. These will be made into a quilt top.

Marsha announced that 36 bowl cozies were turned in to be sold at the Quilt Show. The July activity will be the 2026 Quilt of Valor block.

2026 Quilt Show:

A total of 173 quilts were turned in, 150 are being judged.

The volunteer sheets are located at the sign up table. There are many slots open, members are encouraged to sign up.

Quilt turn in tonight and tomorrow from 9 - 5
Judging is next Tuesday at Gilwood Presbyterian Church. This is a great facility. We will provide lunch on Judging Day. This is a great time to listen in on the judges and learn some of what they look for in quilts.

Set up is Thursday, a reminder that many hands make the setup finished faster. If possible we are looking for individuals that can help with climbing ladders to attach rails to poles, and setting up the poles. Spouses, children, grandchildren are encouraged to participate.

We can still take in additional sponsors – I have a sample of the sponsor sign for Jo's Blueberry Farm.

Door Prize – we will be doing prizes on the hour rather than large baskets at the end of the day.

We will be loading the UHaul from the storage unit on Wednesday about 6 pm. If you are able to help, please let Jackie or Debra know.

Debra will be preparing the free admission sheets for Natalie on Wednesday June 17. Free admission is for working any of the judging days, set up day, or a 2 hour shift during the show.

The Food Trucks will be ApostleQue on Friday, Plated Palette on Saturday. T-Shirts:

Debra Mills announced T-shirts were available for pickup tonight.

Miscellaneous Business:

The door prize drawing was won by Pat Ott.

Wendy Moffitt reminded members about committee vacancies. Since no one has volunteered for the Picnic, Wendy will develop a fun program for everyone. There is a vacancy for the Christmas Party. Karen Bronkhorst has indicated that she will not do Outreach in 2027 so a new chair will be needed for this committee.

The By-Laws Committee will be Sandra Allred, Connie Richardson, and Janneke Bahoman. Connie Olsen volunteered to join the committee.

June birthdays were announced. Fat quarters were available for these members.

Wendy asked everyone to help put away chairs at the end of the meeting. This will help prevent one or two people trying to return the room to the way we found it before leaving.

Wendy reminded everyone that Charity Sew was on Friday at Fire Station #9 in Concord. The last event of the evening was showing Show & Tell by members and our guests. Final Business:
